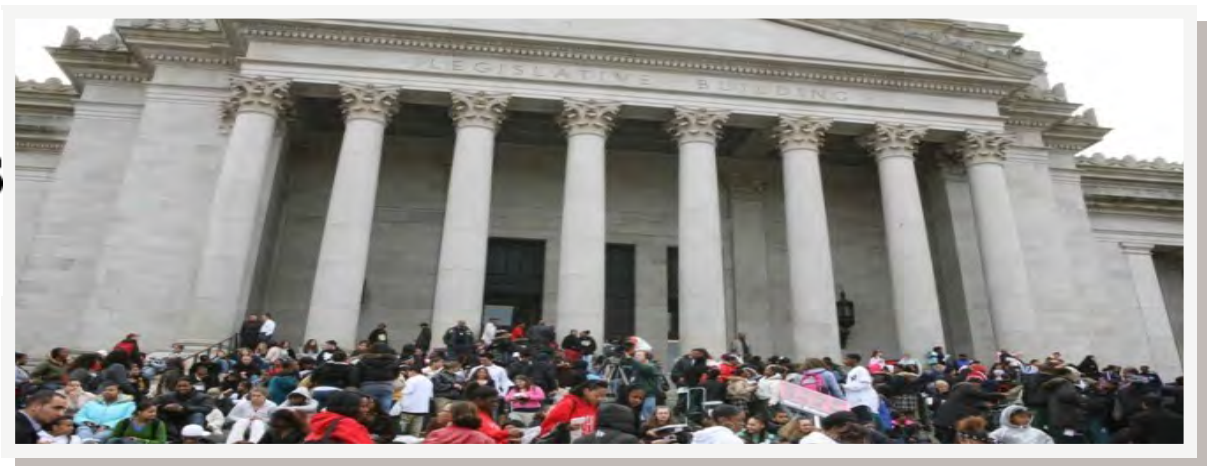

Dear Community Members:

The 2017 legislative session is quickly winding down. Please be aware of the following dates:

- Surviving bills must be voted out of the opposite chamber by Wednesday, April 12.
- The last day of the 2017 regular session is Sunday, April 23.
- Bills that did not progress this year will be considered again when session commences next year.

The shortened list of bills below are those that are still alive. Legislative Planner: Week of April 7, 2017— April 14, 2017

Committee activity has ended for the 2017 session; only floor action remains. Surviving bills must be voted out of the opposite house by Wednesday, April 12th, else they are no longer be considered this year. Conferences on surviving bills and the budget to agree on differences between House and Senate begin Thursday, April 13th, the 96th day.

If no agreement on the budget is reached by Sunday, April 23rd, a special session may be called.
